

Repeated Course Information

Many of you have chosen to repeat courses in which you have received a lower grade than is acceptable to you. This is often a good decision, since repeating a course (in order to “get rid of” a lower grade) is, indeed, the quickest way to raise your GPA—not to mention learn the course material!

You need to be aware of two things, however, when repeating a course:

- 1) The **more recent** grade (not necessarily the higher grade) is computed as part of your GPA. It is very important to do better the second time around!
- 2) Although only the more recent grade is factored into your GPA, both grades will appear on your transcript.

Under the new DARS system, course repeats are automatically updated and you no longer need to file any paperwork for your GPA to count the most recent course. Note that repeated courses will not reflect on the DARS until some time after a grade has been posted for the course.
