Notable Summer 2016 — Spring 2021

In 2016-17 and 2017-18 I served on the Undergraduate Committee for the Department of Psychology. During this service, the committee chair Dr. Monisha Pasupathi tasked me with developing a quantitative methods certificate for undergraduates. This included bringing together representatives from most CSBS departments, defining the scope and educational objectives, working with a marketing research firm to examine the certificate utility, and guiding it through the process of getting university approval. The certificate builds on CSBS strengths in data analytic skills by providing students a demonstrable set of skills that will make them valuable in a multitude of contexts where data and evidence-based decisions are made. The certificate was approved in the summer of 2018 with support from 6 sponsoring CSBS departments.

Since the Summer of 2018 I have been the director of the certificate, which has included all aspects required to run the certificate including creating marketing materials, working with CSBS directors of undergraduate studies, developing an advisory board, working with academic advisors, and arranging outreach efforts. As each certificate requires a unique capstone, my role includes helping undergraduates identify a capstone project, defining the parameters of a capstone, soliciting additional reviewers, and reviewing each capstone. In the 2018-19 and 2019-20 there were 3 and 4 certificates recipients respectively, and this year 2020-21 at least 9 students are on track to receive the Quantitative Research Analytics in the Social Sciences Certificate.
